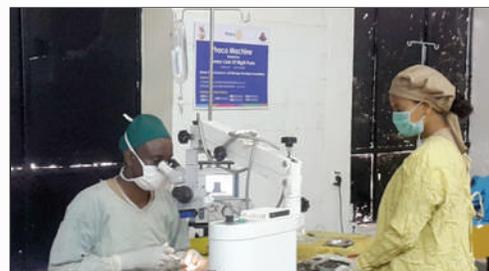


2) **Inauguration of sanitary napkin vending machine** and incinerator installed in Yamunanagar Police Chowki on 12th June 2018.
